Uniform Reminder

PE Kit Next Year

We have bought every child a new PE T-shirt, a pair of black shorts and a draw-string PE bag for September.

In September staff will be getting all children to try them on so that we can give them the right size - names will be written in the clothes and on the PE bag and they will be hung on their peg. Parents need to provide trainers or PE shoes.

Parents are welcome to take the bag home to wash everything, but we do ask that it is returned the next day. The day of PE lessons can change at short notice.

Book Bags Next Year

From September we would like all children in school from Nursery to Year 6 to bring a book bag to school every day.
