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Additional Comments:

- Myself and my child receive excellent, much needed, support from the school.
- Could there be more after school activities for children in Year 1 and Year 2?
- Some classes have a lot of photos on Facebook, but I don't see any of my child.
- Staff always listen and try their best to solve any problems.
- I would like more information on a weekly basis about how my child is getting on in school.
- Some classes don't use Class Dojo often enough to give out reward points.
- There are a lot of opportunities to come into school to talk to school staff.
- Some parents need to be spoken to about their children's behaviour more often.

Our Response:

- More after school clubs would be great – but staff are very busy after school preparing for the next day, meaning that we struggle to get staff to run them. The only option is getting other people in to run clubs at a cost.
- Photos on Facebook are a bonus – teachers are there to teach, not to take photos. It is a shame if you don't see your child on Facebook very often, but be reassured that they are very busy having fun!
- We now offer coffee mornings after every class assembly, information sessions on the curriculum, parents evenings, give points on Class Dojo and post information on Facebook. Parents are welcome to make an appointment after school if they would like more information about how their child is getting on in school.
- Young children need to be taught how to behave. We pride ourselves on doing this in a kind way in conjunction with parents. Some children take longer than others to understand rules and be kind to others, and we work in partnership with the parents of those children.

Thank you so much for all the positive comments. None of the parents who had a concern or gave a negative response gave their name – we therefore cannot follow up on individual issues.
